



BIRD REPORT by Ed Dahl:

The Osprey are nesting all around the area, especially near the lake. A family of Black-billed Magpies have already fledged along our street, which seems a bit early.

The Western Grebes are dancing these days, but their nesting efforts will not likely be successful for a few weeks, until the Shuswap Lake water levels stabilize. Amazingly, the lake water levels are pretty consistent with other years despite the lack of snow locally, and rain. Last year despite the low water levels and the inability to find grebe nests during our weekly counts, the Western Grebes managed very well. Our counts indicated that 134 young Western Grebes were hatched, which was better than recent yearly averages. So don't despair yet, even if the lake levels remain low.

Nashville, Yellow and Wilson's Warblers have returned along with Western Tanager, Bullock's Oriole and Lazuli Bunting at the time of writing this news, plus many more bird species that I have neglected to list. So, it must be spring.

Shuswap Naturalists are giving guided tours locally at 8:30 Saturday mornings. Please gather at the Brighouse Nature Centre and enjoy a walk along the the Nature trail or whatever is featured. Bring binoculars and enjoy what nature displays for us.
